The interns attended tours of a Caravan Ingredients, a wholesale food establishment; Two Bridges Sewage Treatment Plant; Passaic Valley Water Treatment Plant and the MUA transfer station in Parsippany. They accompanied REHSs on various environmental and regulatory inspections.

The nurses completed preceptoring a 30 hour Community Health Nursing program for a nursing student from Florham Park who is working on her Bachelor of Science in nursing degree. The student, Elizabeth Vassallo, RN, is a studying at ECPI University in Newport News, VA. She observed and participated in many Health Department activities including the Child Health Conference, retail food inspections, communicable disease investigation and Blood Pressure Clinics for Senior Citizens.
