A Food Handler Training Class given in Bloomingtondale in March with two people attending from Bloomingtondale establishments. This was a morning session.

Update on food handler classes:

Bloomingtondale has adopted an ordinance requiring any person engaged or employed in the business or service of preparing, processing or serving food or drink intended for human consumption at Risk Type 2, 3, or 4 food establishments must attend a food handlers' training course given by the health department or a comparable course approved by the health department. To date, 67 employees have received food handler training. This training was given either by the health department (48), ServSafe (5), or corporate training (14). The REHS is concentrating on registering those in non-compliance for the upcoming food handling training class scheduled for May 13, 2013.
