BJ's: The lot and garbage areas were well maintained. Minimal debris along the fence line.

Complaints

Bloomingtondale:

- ⇒ Walter Dr. Garbage cans being put out with no lids—abated

Riverdale:

- ⇒ Newberry St: Resident stated construction of the Black Bull Restaurant caused increase rodent activity on his property. This complaint is unfounded.
- ⇒ RER: Numerous odor complaints have been received. At time of inspection the odors were offensive. People from Riverdale Crossing were complaining about nausea and illness caused by the odor. I spoke to Drew Flockhart regarding the complaints. He stated he was in compliance and had all permits to operate in accordance to his operation. The DEP was contacted and a team was to visit the facility to do an inspection on 12/1/17
- ⇒ Hamburg Tpk.: An open septic field at this address has not been covered. The homeowner is waiting for the location of the sewer line to be established so that a hook up to the sewer can be made.

Florham Park:

- ⇒ Mangia: Pre-operational inspection. Most of the equipment has been replaced and the interior dining area has been redone. A hand wash sink is to be installed in the employee rest room to be in compliance with the Health Department requirements.
- ⇒ Sun Valley: Overflowing dumpsters—notice was given to the management company regarding the complaint. The supervisor of the complex stated the Holiday created more garbage and one less pick up was done because of the Holiday (Thanksgiving) schedule. Routine monitoring will be done by the Health Department to ensure that the receptacles are large enough and there are a sufficient amount to accommodate the needs of the residents.
