1. Cedar Crest Emergency Access – At the last meeting of the Township Council direction was received to research emergency access to the Cedar Crest campus, following a question from the audience. A review of the Cedar Crest files was undertaken and the presence of an emergency access road was confirmed. C) NJDCA Local Recreation Improvement Grant FY2025 Greenview Park Playing Court Lighting & Controls

Applications for the Local Recreation Improvement Grant are due by January 31, 2025. Following a review of eligible projects and the Township's capital plan for the year, lights and lighting controls at the pickleball/tennis/basketball courts in Greenview Park were selected as the subject of this application. Enclosed with the resolution for the Council's consideration of approval is additional information on the application for \$60,000 toward this \$152,000 project.

D) Chamber of Commerce Street Fair - Municipal Costs

Township staff was approached regarding the Chamber of Commerce Street Fair returning to Newark-Pompton Turnpike after being relocated to PV Park for the past couple of years. With respect to preparations and clean up as well as an agreed upon safety plan, staff costs incurred by the Public Works Department and Police Department are estimated to be \$4,437 and \$8,460, respectively based upon the initially presented plan. A resolution approving the event has been scheduled for action by the Township Council. As a component of the application, direction is needed regarding who will be responsible for these costs or if the Township will be absorbing them.

E) Ordinance Establishing and Preserving a Cap Bank

Under the 1977 Appropriations Cap Law, municipalities have the opportunity to adopt an ordinance that raises the maximum allowable increase in the tax levy from 2% to 3.5% for the current year and retain or bank the amount available from the prior two (2) years, i.e., 2023 and 2024. It is important to note that the ordinance establishes the ability to increase "in cap" appropriations and carry excess cap bank from the prior years; it does not increase the appropriations, an outcome which would require additional legislative action. In essence, it is an insurance policy with no downside that I am aware of, if adopted.

<u>F) Pequannock Township Fire Department Junior Firefighter Membership – Residency Requirement</u>

Following discussion and direction at the prior meeting of the Township Council on January 14, 2025, as recommended by the Fire Department, an ordinance has been prepared for introduction updating the residency requirement for Junior Firefighters.

With respect to eligibility for the Junior Firefighters Auxiliary, the following language is present in the Township Code:

"Chapter 5-87. Junior Firefighters Auxiliary Section D (1) states: Applicants for junior membership in the Pequannock Township Fire Department shall reside within the Pequannock Township border and be a minimum of 14 years of age."

The drafted ordinance changes the above to:

"Applicants for junior membership in the Pequannock Township Fire Department shall reside within the Township of Pequannock or reside within any municipality that is contiguous with the Township of Pequannock and be a minimum of 14 years of age."

G) Pompton Plans Railroad Station Exterior Restoration Project

On January 16, 2025, the Township received and opened bids for the restoration of the exterior of the Pompton Plains Railroad Station. Some of the major work within the project is the replacement of the roof, repairs to the gutter system, and painting and repairing the exterior of the building. Three bids were received with the base bids enumerated as follows:

- 1. Alden Bailey Restoration Corporation \$324,810.00
- 2. John O'Hara Company, Inc. \$403,930.00
- 3. Spartan Construction \$475,000

The low bid submitted by Alden Bailey Restoration Corporation was reviewed to determine if it is responsive and responsible by the Township Attorney, Historic Architect and Qualified Purchasing Agent/Township Manager. All parties have confirmed the bid is responsive and responsible and recommend an award to Alden Bailey Restoration Corporation for the base bid amount of \$324,810, accepting Unit Price No. 1: Roof Sheathing Replacement at \$15.00/ square foot and Unit Price No. 2: Exterior Wall Board Replacement at \$22.50/ square foot.

It is also important to note that this project is being supported by a grant from the Morris County Historic Preservation Trust fund in the amount of \$345,723. The project budget includes the grant award and cash match totaling \$432,154 for professional service fees and construction. Should the construction cost ultimately be lower than the grant amount for that purpose, the grant/cash match amounts will be lowered proportionally.



As requested, I have done a brief review of the site plans, as well as publicly available aerials to investigate whether the Cedar Crest Village site was constructed with a separate, emergency access road. The Amended Preliminary & Final Site Plans for Phase 2 of the project depict both the main gated entrance from Cotluss Road (south of the 'Home Depot' jug handle) as well as the emergency access driveway off of a different portion of Cotluss Road (located in Kinnelon, directly off Rt 23 south, just south of the previous Kosco Harley Davidson, now a Raymore & Flannigan). Ordinances for Introduction

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ORDINANCE NO. 2024-01

For Introduction January 28, 2025

ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AND PRESERVE A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Pequannock in the County of Morris finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2025 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, is estimated to be \$ 161,214.77 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Township Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of Pequannock, in the County of Morris, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Pequannock shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased up to 3.5%, amounting to \$564,251.70 and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the Township of Pequannock be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized herein above that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and, **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-02

For Introduction January 28, 2025

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5-87 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PEQUANNOCK AND EXPANDING ELIGIBILITY FOR THE JUNIOR FIREFIGHTER PROGRAM TO INCLUDE INDIVIDUALS RESIDING IN ANY MUNICIPALITY THAT IS CONTIGUOUS WITH THE TOWNSHIP OF PEQUANNOCK

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Pequannock, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- **Section 1**. Chapter 5 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Pequannock, Section 5-87 entitled "Junior Firefighters Auxiliary" shall be amended by the following amendment to subsection B which shall read in its entirety as follows:
 - B. Any resident of the Township of Pequannock or a municipality that is contiguous with the Township of Pequannock between 14 and 18 years of age shall be eligible for membership in the Junior Firefighter's Auxiliary. No individual shall become a member of the Junior Firefighter's Auxiliary unless permission shall be obtained from such individual's parent or legal guardian. Such permission shall be in writing and acknowledged or proved in the manner required by law for deeds to real estate to be recorded. The original written permission shall be retained by the Township Clerk with a copy of the same to be forwarded by the Clerk to the Fire Department Chief.
- **Section 2**. Chapter 5 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Pequannock, Section 5-87 entitled "Junior Firefighters Auxiliary" shall be amended by the following amendment to subsection D (1) which shall read in its entirety as follows:
 - (1) Applicants for junior membership in the Pequannock Township Fire Department shall reside within the Township of Pequannock or reside within any municipality that is contiguous with the Township of Pequannock and be a minimum of 14 years of age.
- **Section 3**. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid in any Court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the other sections or provisions of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.
- **Section 4**. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **Section 5**. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law

Adam,

As we discussed, the NJ Department of Community Affairs is soliciting 2025 grant applications for Local Recreational Improvements. The Township has been successful in both 2023 (Greenview Pond Relining) and 2024 (Washington Field Lighting Controls) in being awarded reimbursement grants from this funding mechanism. For consideration, I offer the following description for this year's application:

- The existing lighting at the multi-use courts is a blend of original lighting components and recently installed LED upgraded heads. Procuring these replacement fixture heads is has been sporadic given the available nationwide supply is extremely limited. The replacement heads were manually aimed by Township staff and electrician.
- The expansion of sports (pickleball) available on the Greenview Park courts in 2024 had generated additional need for court time. The anticipated increase in the number of pickleball courts, as well as the introduction of a basketball court will likely result in the need for extended operating hours.
- Currently, the lighting controls are a mix of manual operation of breakers and timed security lighting. The Department of Public Works has investigated and solicited a proposal to supply a complete set 'pre-designed' LED fixtures that can be mounted on the existing poles. The proposal also includes a programmable lighting controls system that can be operated remotely.
- The lighting controls are similar to what will be installed this year at the Washington Park Fields, which were included in the Township's 2024 grant approval.
- The installation of a cohesive lighting and control system complements the recent improvements of the Greenview Park courts.


