A) Ordinance Establishing and Preserving a Cap Bank

Under the 1977 Appropriations Cap Law, municipalities have the opportunity to adopt an ordinance that raises the maximum allowable increase in the tax levy from 2% to 3.5% for the current year and retain or bank the amount available from the prior two (2) years, i.e., 2023 and 2024. It is important to note that the ordinance establishes the ability to increase "in cap" appropriations and carry excess cap bank from the prior years; it does not increase the appropriations, an outcome which would require additional legislative action. In essence, it is an insurance policy with no downside that I am aware of, if adopted.

B) Town Hall Late Night Concessions – 2nd Tuesday of the Month

On January 12, 2025, the Township of Pequannock published the required notice in the Suburban Trends to solicit proposals for Town Hall Late Night Concessions. Six proposals were received and opened on January 29, 2025; the results are provided below.

Based on a review of the proposals submitted and a desire to have some variety for the public, it is recommended that the contracts for Town Hall Late Night Concessions be awarded to all those who submitted proposals for the total amount of \$1,695.

C) Concession Providers for Various Parks and Recreation Events

The Township of Pequannock solicited proposals for concession vendors at various parks and recreation activates/events in a manner that was consistent with past years. Following advertisement in the official newspaper on January 12, 2025, proposals were received with a due date of January 29, 2025. Four vendors submitted proposals for identified activities; Empanada Times, Harpers Amusement, Jacks Kettle Corn and Just a Little Something with a total contribution equaling \$560. A resolution of award has been prepared for the consideration of the Township Council.

D) 2024 Concession Operator for the Pequannock Valley (PV) Park Lake

On January 12, 2025, the Township of Pequannock published the legal notice for the RFP for the PV Park Concession stand. The notice was also published on the Township's website.

Following receipt on or before 10:00 AM, Thursday, February 6, 2025, one proposal from Sean Leonardo dba The Joshua Tree was received and opened. The proposal is responsive to the RFP and is therefore recommended for award; the sum contribution amount is \$2,751.00.

E) Wells 1 and 2 PFAS Treatment Amendment to Professional Services Agreement with H2M Based upon requirement of the NJ IBANK, additional services are required from the Township's Water and Sewer Consulting Engineer for the PFAS mitigation project. Included with the proposed resolution is a copy of the letter explaining the requirements for the services and enumerating the corresponding costs. As noted within the letter, "In summary, H2M requests an additional \$20,000 for the additional effort for the permitting and funding assistance, \$5,500 for the Bidding Services, and \$254,000 for the Construction-Related Services for a total request for additional authorization of \$279,500."

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-01

ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AND PRESERVE A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Pequannock in the County of Morris finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2025 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, is estimated to be \$ 161,214.77 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Township Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of Pequannock, in the County of Morris, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Pequannock shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased up to 3.5%, amounting to \$ 564,251.70 and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the Township of Pequannock be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized herein above that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and, **BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Concession Operator shall operate the concession stand located at Pequannock Valley (PV) Park in the Township of Pequannock. The Concession Operator shall provide all necessary supervision and staffing to prepare the concession stand for operation, operate the park concession stand as specified during the operating season, and clean up and close the concession stand at the completion of the lake season.

Operating Requirements - The concession stand shall be operated at all times in accordance with the following requirements:

The concession stand shall be open during all hours of operation for the park, from May 24, 2025 through September 1, 2025, including special events such as swim meets. July 12, 2025 is the annual PV Park Food Truck Festival; the Concession Operator may elect to remain closed during the event.

- 1. Specific hours of operation are as follows:
 - May 24, 2025 through June 22, 2025: Mon-Fri 2 PM to 7 PM, Sat 10 AM to 7 PM, Sun 11 AM to 7 PM
 - June 23, 2025 through July 20, 2025: Mon-Sat 10 AM to 8 PM, Sun 11 AM to 8 PM
 - July 21, 2024 through September 1, 2025: Mon-Sat 10 AM to 7 PM, Sun 11AM to 7 PM
- The Concession Operator shall provide an adult supervisor, at least 21 years of age at all times at the concession stand.
- 3. The Concession Operator shall be responsible for properly training all staff members and shall require staff to attend food handling courses if required by the Health Officer.
- 4. The Concession Operator shall be responsible for keeping the patio area, including any picnic tables, benches and trash containers, clean at all times.
- 5. The Concession Operator shall provide any additional equipment he/she deems necessary, e.g., soda dispensing equipment and freezer, at his/her own expense.
- 6. The Concession Operator shall obtain all required Board of Health permits and licenses and maintain the Concession stand in accordance with Board of Health requirements. It is the Concession Operator's responsibility to schedule all required Board of Health inspections, prior to opening.
- 7. No tobacco products or chewing gum may be sold at the concession stand.
- 8. All beverages shall be sold in paper cups or plastic bottles. Glass bottles shall not be permitted.

- 9. No vending machines shall be permitted without the express written approval of the Township.
- 10. Insurance as further described under Insurance Requirements
- 11. The Concession Operator shall provide adequate staffing at all times so that the time required to be served does not become excessive.
- 12. The Concession Operator shall provide a selection of menu items and pricing on basic items and coordinate prices on a par with other similar municipal concession stands.
- 13. The Concession Operator shall adequately clean, to the satisfaction of the Health Officer and the Director of Recreation, the concession stand and remove all inventory within two (2) weeks of the park's closing.
- 14. Following award of the contract but prior to the opening date of the season, the Concession Operator shall submit a list of names of all supervisors and employees and corresponding evidence from the NJ State Police, documenting a lack of criminal history for each/all employees.
- 15. The Township of Pequannock shall pay for all utilities and repair or replace, as necessary, any equipment in the concession stand which has been supplied by the Township, unless the proposer's negligence is determined to be the cause of any failure. The determination of the presence or absence of negligence will fall to the Director of Parks and Recreation in consultation with the Director of Public Works. The determination of the Directors may be ultimately appealed to the Township Manager. The Township Manager's decision shall be final.

Proposed Menu – Each proposer shall submit a proposed menu with pricing for each concession stand. The Concession Operator shall agree to provide no less than 90 percent of the items proposed and to provide the following mandatory items: soda (regular and diet); iced tea (regular and diet); coffee; bottled water; hamburgers and hotdogs; French fries; chicken strips or tenders and ice cream. Pricing for menu items cannot be increased from the quote price at any time during the duration of the contract without the prior written approval of the Township Manager.

Health Regulations – The Concession Operator shall comply with all requirements of the Township of Pequannock Board of Health and Health Officer.

The Concession Operator shall keep the concession stand and all adjoining seating areas, tables and benches clean and free from litter and debris at all times. Prior to opening each day, all counters and floors shall be cleaned and the seating area shall be washed down. Further, all tables shall be washed on a regular basis throughout the day.

The Concession Operator shall remove all garbage to the dumpsters on a regular basis, at least once daily, and shall comply with all recycling requirements of the Township.

Concession Fee - Proposers shall list a proposed concession fee on the included proposal form.

The Concession Operator shall make payment in accordance with the following schedule:

- I. Upon execution of the Contract and submission of required insurance indemnification, and Prior to May 24, 2025-50% of Concession Fee

Conduct of Employees – The Concession Operator, his/her employees, staff and supervisors shall, at all times, conduct themselves in a professional, courteous, pleasant and enthusiastic manner. All employees shall be well-groomed and properly attired at all times.

Concession Operator's Suppliers – The Township reserves the right to require a list of all suppliers providing food, products and supplies to the Concession Operator for his/her operation. The Concession Operator may be required to obtain a release of lien from all such suppliers and may be required to provide documentation that all suppliers have been paid in full. This amount shall not be a penalty, but liquidated damages, and shall constitute a fair and reasonable estimate of the amount the Township will suffer by reason of such default.

In the event the Concession Operator fails to open for business and operate for a total of more than twenty (20) hours during normal hours of park operation during the park season, the Township may, in addition to or in lieu of the liquidated damages set forth above, declare the Concession Operator to be in default of the contract. In the event the Township declares the Concession Operator to be in default of the contract, the Township shall have the right to immediately terminate the contract. CONTRACT FORM

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The vendor shall purchase and maintain such comprehensive general liability and other insurance as will provide protection and hold the Township harmless from claims set forth below which may arise out of or result from the vendors performance of the work and successful concessionaire's other obligations under the contract documents, whether such performance of the work is by the concessionaire or by any subcontractor, by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable in accordance with the following:







WHEREAS, Crew Engineers, Inc., was acquired by H2M Architects & Engineers, Inc. on January 27, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Township of Pequannock approved the assignment of the contract from Crew Engineers, Inc. to H2M Architects & Engineers Inc. on October 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, H2M provided a proposal for an additional amount of \$15,000 for the preparation of a Treatment Works Application associated with the project, which was approved on January 9, 2024 via resolution 2024-55; and

WHEREAS, Based upon requirements of the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJ IBANK), the scope of the project has been expended to now require additional bidding services and construction related inspection services; and

WHEREAS, H2M has provided a proposal for the additional amount of \$259,500; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that: <u>06-215-55-673-000</u> (Ord 2022-13) has funds available in the amount of \$259,500 for additional engineering costs for the PFAS remediation project.

In 2022, Crew Engineers, Inc. (Crew) submitted a proposal to the Township of Pequannock (Township) for the design of PFAS treatment for Wells 1 and 2, and for bid phase and construction phase services, which was awarded to Crew on October 25, 2022 (Resolution No. R2022-185). In 2023, Crew was acquired by H2M and the Township assigned Crew's contract to H2M on October 24, 2023 (Resolution No. R2023-216). Additionally, H2M's scope was increased to include preparation of a Treatment Works Approval permit application (Resolution No. R2024-55).

The project has been designed and permits secured and H2M is assisting the Township in securing funding for the project through the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB), formerly NJ Environmental Infrastructure Trust, Financing Program. Based on increased complexity of coordination requirements and the need for additional supporting technical documentation, H2M's effort in the permitting and funding aspects of the project was higher than contemplated in the previously authorized amounts, and H2M requests an additional authorization in the amount of \$20,000 to cover those higher costs.

Additionally, a condition of the NJIB Financing Program is that the engineering agreement for bid phase and construction phase services must include a specified scope, which is more extensive than that included in the 2022 Crew proposal. To meet the requirements of the NJIB Financing Program, H2M proposes the following amended scope of services during the bid and construction phases of the Wells 1 and 2 PFAS Treatment project, which replaces the Bidding Services and Construction-Related Services listed in the 2022 Crew Proposal.

H2M will perform the following major activities and tasks during the bidding and construction phases:

- Submit notification to Morris County Soil Conservation District (MCSCD) in compliance with Plan Certification.
- Act as the Township's professional representative during construction, provide assistance to the Township relative to construction activities, provide interpretation of construction requirements as may be needed during construction, and assist the Township in resolution of construction issues. This will include monthly progress reports, communication with NJDEP, and maintenance of project files required by NJDEP.
- Coordinate and attend Preconstruction Meeting. Issue Notice to Proceed and meeting minutes.
- Review Progress Schedules, Schedule of Submittals, and Schedule of Values furnished by the Contractor.
- Review Shop Drawings for construction materials and other submittals, including test results, furnished by the Contractor to determine compliance with Contract requirements.
- Prepare Record Drawings for the constructed improvements based on the field sketches prepared by H2M's field personnel and submit in electronic format.
- Certify to the NJDEP that the project was constructed in accordance with the approved plans and specifications by submitting a signed and sealed Placed-in-Service Certification to the NJDEP at the conclusion of construction and assist with NJIB loan closeout.

Construction Observation

 Provide full-time construction observation to measure and record material quantities for payment, monitor Contractor's progress, and check conformance with the Contract requirements, which is needed for the Placed-in-Service Certification to the NJDEP and NJIB loan, including Contractor's environmental protection and restoration measures. - Coordinate and attend weekly Construction Meetings (40 meetings). If needed, H2M will host virtual meetings. Issue meeting minutes.
- Maintain daily construction reports recording Contractor's activities and work performance, including
 field sketches for installed work. An electronic copy of these reports and sketches will be provided to
 the Township at the end of the project upon request.
- Review and process Contractor's monthly requests for progress payments and furnish recommendations to the Township; submit contractor's requests for payment to NJDEP. We anticipate twelve (12) payment requests.
- Participate in the resolution of issues involving unforeseen field conditions, review and provide recommendations to the Township for any field modifications, review cost proposals, request NJDEP approval, and issue appropriate Change Orders to Contractor when needed.
- Coordinate and witness field testing of sanitary infrastructure performed by Contractor.
- Coordinate and witness field testing and disinfection of potable water infrastructure performed by Contractor.
- Coordinate and witness startup of equipment and systems performed by Contractor.
- Assist the Township in a final walkthrough inspection and developing a punch list, and coordinating any required training.
- Evaluate and issue certificates for substantial and final completion, review and process Contractor's request for final payment, and furnish recommendation to the Township.

Engineering Fee, Billing Method, and Terms of Service

Based on the foregoing understanding and Scope of Services, H2M has estimated its level of effort, subconsultant fees, and costs to provide the services described in this Additional Authorization Request and proposes estimated fees of \$10,000 and \$404,000 for Bidding Services and Construction-Related Services, respectively. The 2022 Crew proposal included estimated fees of \$4,500 and \$150,000 for Bidding Services and Construction-Related Services, respectively. Therefore, H2M requests additional authorization as follows:

The engineering fees for the Bidding and Construction-Related Services to be performed for the project, as presented in this Additional Authorization Request, will be on the basis of hourly fee rates plus reimbursable expenses in accordance with the enclosed Billing Rate Schedule.

The engineering fees for Construction-Related Services are dependent on the activities of the Contractor (who is not yet known), his experience, and progress of work, as well as the conditions encountered during construction and the requirements from any authority having jurisdiction. For the purpose of preparing this Additional Authorization Request, we have allowed for Shop Drawing review during a one

(1) month period; five (5) months for fabrication and delivery of materials, during which time there would be no construction activity; three (3) months for site preparation, utility construction, and foundation construction, during which time there would be full-time H2M field staff; and six (6) months for construction of the treatment facility, during which time there would be full-time H2M field staff. We have, therefore, included the services of H2M field personnel for the respective anticipated time periods.

In summary, H2M requests an additional \$20,000 for the additional effort for the permitting and funding assistance, \$5,500 for the Bidding Services, and \$254,000 for the Construction-Related Services for a total request for additional authorization of \$279,500.

The return of a signed copy will confirm the Township's acceptance of this contract amendment and authorization of the additional services.
